## **Summary**

Your ability to summarize shows your understanding of the text. For each chapter describe the 4-5 most important events. Stuck? Think WHO/WHAT/WHERE/WHEN/WHY/HOW?

## 2-3 Questions

Types of Questions you may ask:

- o **Clarifying** questions, often start with Who, What, When, Where. Answers are readily available in the text.
- **Below the surface** questions, start with How or Why. Answers require analysis of the text \*(i.e. the answers are in the text but not obvious).
- O **Beyond** questions do not have a single correct answer. They are open-ended questions about opinions or connection with the text.

## **<u>2-3 Quotes</u>** (with 1 sentence of analysis for each)

- Record quotes from important passages of text (i.e. pivotal moments where you discover something about a character, symbol, theme, particular conflict, or just examples of descriptive language that intrigues you).
- Analyze the quote. How do you feel about it? Why is it important?

## Reaction

- Write a reaction to what you just read. What do you think about the characters and conflicts?
- Make connections: did the passage you read remind you of another part in the book or something else you've read?
- Did you feel mad/confused/relieved/happy/offended/shocked by what you read?
